<b>PE Apprentice</b>	New PE apprentice for 2014-2015 was employed.	Increased skill set within the school. Maximised lesson time. Broad range of provision offered to pupils. Efficient and accurate assessment of pupils. Less active pupils more engaged during PE lessons.
<b>Curriculum Development</b>	PE staff attended CPD organised by SGO PE equipment replenished. Broad and engaging curriculum developed.	PE staff are confident and competent to deliver high quality PE lessons. High quality resources available to pupils. Quality of all PE lesson is at least good.
<b>Achievement of Pupils</b>	A simple assessment tool was implanted to monitor progress of pupils.	Pupils made good progress during PE lessons. Pupils felt a sense of achievement during PE lessons.

Target of 50% of Y5/6 pupils participating in a level 2 competition was achieved. Purchasing netball posts allowed pupils to take part in intra netball competitions. Pupils enjoy taking part in competition events and feel proud when rewarded in assembly for their sporting success.
